SECTION 2: Hazards identification

The main hazard associated with kiln furniture is personal injury due to impact or abrasion with the article. The material is of low acute toxicity; however long-term exposure to any respirable dust created by careless handling or machining of the articles can be hazardous to health if precautions outlined in section 8 are not observed.

SECTION 3: Composition/information on ingredients

Kiln furniture articles are made from ceramic materials fired (cured) to over 1200oC. The main minerals present in the fired articles include cordierite and mullite, however some ranges may also include siliceous glass, corundum and zircon. Some articles may contain a small proportion of cristobalite (<1%).

SECTION 4: First aid measures

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

The product is heat resistant, non-flammable and does not decompose on heating. Packaging material fires may be extinguished using a general purpose fire extinguisher. No special precautions required.

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

Loose articles should be packed in boxes / crates or restacked on pallets. Broken items should be gathered up by any method that avoids the creation of airborne dust.

SECTION 7: Handling and storage

Unlimited shelf life. Store in a dry place. Although not essential, gloves may be beneficial in preventing abrasion of the skin while handling the product for long periods.

SECTION 8: Exposure Controls/personal protection

If WELs are exceeded in the working area (see section 3), respirators should be worn.

SECTION 9: Physical and Chemical Properties

9.1. Information on basic physical and chemical properties

Appearance - Porous solid, white to light brown in colour

Melting point - Melts above 1400 oC

Bulk Density - 1.0 - 2.2 g/cm3

Solubility - Insoluble in water or organic solvents

Flammability - Non-flammable

SECTION 10: Stability and reactivity

Chemically inert to most acids, alkalis or solvents. Attacked by hydrofluoric acid.

SECTION 11: Toxicological information

11.1. Information on toxicological effects

Long term exposure to excessive concentrations of airborne dust created by careless handling or machining of kiln furniture articles may be harmful to the lungs.

SECTION 12: Ecological Information

Inert with respect to the environment. Non-biodegradable.

SECTION 13: Disposal considerations

13.1. Waste treatment methods

Dispose of as non-toxic material in accordance with local regulations for dry and inert waste.

SECTION 14: Transport information

The products are not classified as hazardous for transport. No special precautions required.

SECTION 15: Regulatory information

Dangerous Preparations Directive (88/379/EEC). Hazard Warning Label not required.
