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<b>STOT - repeated exposure</b>	In June 2003 SCOEL (the EU Scientific Committee on Occupational Exposure Limits) concluded that the main effect in humans of the inhalation of respirable crystalline silica is silicosis. "There is sufficient information to conclude that the relative risk of lung cancer is increased in persons with silicosis (and apparently, not in persons without silicosis exposed to silica dusts in quarries and the ceramic industry. Therefore preventing the onset of silicosis will reduce the cancer risk.....(SCOEL.SUM Doc 94-final, June 2003)
<b>Target organs</b>	Respiratory system, lungs
<b>Inhalation</b>	Prolonged and/or massive exposure to respirable crystalline silica-containing dust may cause silicosis, a nodular pulmonary fibrosis caused by deposition in the lungs of fine respirable particles of crystalline silica.
<b>Ingestion</b>	No harmful effects expected from quantities likely to be ingested by accident.
<b>Skin contact</b>	Prolonged contact may cause redness, irritation and dry skin.
<b>Eye contact</b>	May cause temporary eye irritation.
